

**ITINERARY: East Africa Safari**  
**Great Migration Kenya & or Tanzania**  
**Burnt Pine -safari**

(B): Breakfast; (BB): Bed & Breakfast; (L): Lunch;  
(D): Dinner; (b): Bed only

**NOTE:** July-August is prime time for the migration in the Masai Mara. In early September the herds usually start moving back to the Serengeti in Tanzania. Since we can't control the rains it becomes a bit of a crap shoot as to where they are. Like us, Africa is experiencing climate change. The short rains started while I was there in Aug this past year, which is early.

**Day 1,**

Depart the US for the overnight flight to Nairobi if starting in Kenya, or Kilimanjaro if starting in Tanzania. Most flight options route with change of planes in Europe, and arrive in the evening.

**Day 2,**

You will be met after Immigration/Customs and transferred to your hotel. Visas are available at the airport.

**Day 3,**

After breakfast you will transfer to Wilson, the domestic airport, and take a scheduled flight to the Masai Mara National Park. You will be staying inside the Park, or adjacent the Park utilizing one of the fixed base tented safari camps.

**Day 4 & 5**

Even if the Migration isn't in full swing, there are still plenty of resident animals and cats to make it a special experience. A great option would be to do an early morning hot air balloon ride.

**Day 6,**

Consider this mostly a travel day, as you are heading down into Tanzania and the Serengeti. To get there you have to pass back through Nairobi. There you will change planes for Arusha to enter Tanzania. From there it's on to the bush, ending up at Klein's Camp in the Serengeti.

**Day 7 & 8,**

If you missed the Migration in the Mara, you should be able to catch it here. Klein's is in the Serengeti so you can see game from your veranda. They use open 4X4 vehicles which make for excellent game viewing. None of our recommended camps use micro buses. The camp has just ten thatched stone cottages, making it a personal experience. Whitewashed walls and rich wooden floors, combined with soft cream furnishings, create a calm and soothing refuge from the adventures of the day. The chalets even have their own fireplaces. The food and wines are excellent.
