### Day 1,

Depart a gateway city for Paris (CDG). Convenient gateways are Atlanta, JFK, Newark, Cincinnati, Dallas, & Miami.

### Day 2,

You will arrive at Paris Charles de Gaulle Airport this morning. We will find you a hotel just off of the Champs-Elysees and in the shadow of the Arch de Triumph. It will be a convenient base of operations while you visit the "City of Lights". After you settle in your room, and freshen up, I suggest you take a short walk to La Duree. After enjoying your late lunch, it's off to the Rodin Museum. You will be viewing the works and personal collection of Auguste Rodin and Camille Claudel. ### Day 3,

### Day 4,

After enjoying breakfast, you will go to The Muse'e d'Orsay. This museum houses world-famous artistic masterpieces from the period 1848-1914. The guided visit provides a general view of the permanent collections; from paintings to fine art.. The remainder will be free perhaps you might treat yourself to a "designer" souvenir. ### Day 5,

After having your petite dejeuner, you will be picked up for a tour of Giverny and Versailles.

The day begins with a visit to Monet's House in Giverny and its famous water lily garden followed by a discovery of the American Art Museum. Lunch is taken in the delightful Moulin de Fourges. In the afternoon, you will visit to the Palace of Versailles. You will then go back into the past and plunge into the world of Louis XIV in the heart of the Castle of Versailles. While you visit the Great Apartments, the Hall of Mirrors and the Queen's Apartments, your guide will tell you all about the building of the castle and life at the court.
